Capital Leasing Program

If your facility or organization needs equipment that costs \$100,000 or more, consider taking advantage of Office of Acquisition and Materiel Management's (OA&MM) Capital Leasing Program to spread the purchase cost over as many as five years. Many Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) facilities and organizations are already using this program to reduce their up-front costs for expensive equipment --- everything from CT scanners and cardiac catheterization equipment to food service delivery systems and mobile health screening vans. Whether you need surgical microscopes, telecommunications equipment or a new dictation system, the Capital Leasing Program benefits facilities and organizations that need equipment now but can't pay the full purchase price this year.

Participants in the Capital Leasing Program pay for their equipment in installments --- spread out from one to five years --- under a lease-to-own arrangement with a minimal service fee to cover administrative costs. The facility or organization buying the equipment determines the length of the lease and can pay off or pay down the lease balance at any time. This "early buyout" feature facilitates wise use of end-of-year funds.

The Capital Leasing Program offers other advantages too. Equipment purchased under this arrangement receives the same leveraged purchase discounts given equipment purchased outright. Lease payments, budgeted only in the amount of annual payments, can be made from either equipment or operating funds. Finally, the lease service fee cost is low --- 5 percent on the declining balance for VA customers and 6 percent for other Government agencies.

Catch up with JWOD at FAC 2003

The 2003 Federal Acquisition Conference and Exhibitor Fair (FAC) is the premier mechanism for government-wide liaison among Federal agencies, the private sector, and other governmental entities concerning official acquisition management issues. Its sponsors, the Procurement Executive's Council, the Federal Acquisition Institute, the General Services Administration and the Department of Defense, represent Federal agencies and policymakers involved with the rules, operation, maintenance, and scheduling of official procurement. The FAC provides Federal employees with an opportunity to network with vendors; Federal government acquisition professionals; all levels of government contracting and procurement professionals; management information system providers; and private industry parties interested in learning cutting-edge technology related to procurement management.

Perhaps even more important to Federal customers, though, is the full range of acquisition training opportunities available at FAC 2003—which includes a unique breakout session entitled “Small Business Acquisition—JWOD/SBA” that will cover both Javits-Wagner-O’Day (JWOD) Program and small business topics. Hosted by Dr. Rita Wells, Deputy Executive Director, Committee for Purchase From People Who Are Blind or Severely Disabled; and Linda G. Williams, Associate Administrator for Government Contracting, Small Business Administration, this session will feature new and innovative techniques on Performance Based Service Contracting, bundling, prime vendor contracts, privatization, purchase cards, and other topics to assist contracting/acquisition professionals in meeting socioeconomic goals. The speakers will also share success stories of JWOD-associated agencies and small business firms mobilizing to meet the demands, including security needs, of Federal agencies. Paradigms of Success

"If you are going to live in the North Country your children better learn to play ice hockey". So, not surprisingly, as another long winter draws to a close, so does another season of youth hockey in Upstate New York.

Reflecting back on all those long cold days since early December, I pause to consider just how much my youngsters and their teammates have developed and learned since the beginning of the season.

With great emotional restraint, trying always to remember that the whole idea is to have fun, I watched intently as all the players tried very hard to focus on the duties and responsibilities of the specific positions that they were assigned. In spite of a common team goal, throughout a good part of the season, each game seemed to be an "every player for themselves" free for all.

Eventually recognizing that greater emphasis was needed on team performance, coaches began to focus on team skills rather than individual skills. And at game time what was the result of this shift in training? You guessed it, an "every player for themselves" free for all.

Once on the ice, each player seemed to remain totally focused on what they were initially taught, the exact functions of their assigned position. And it was exactly this focus that kept them from effectively seeing how their position fit with and

supported the functions of the positions assigned to their teammates. Only late in the season, when players started to identify that their own best effort was insufficient to ensure team success did they begin to grasp the importance of their teammates and, at least on occasion, pass the puck.

As adults we also remember the initial training we received on the specific functions, responsibilities, and skills required for our jobs. Many times in our own professional careers we stay so focused on these individual elements, that we risk seeing just how what we do fits with and supports an overall team goal.

The next time your team seems to be losing more games than they are winning, or functioning in an “every player for themselves” mode, consider the need to focus some attention on how each team member’s role fits with and supports the other members of the team. And, if necessary, *pass the puck!*

FSS Maximum Orders

Federal Supply Schedule contracts had a limit called a Maximum Order Limitation (MOL). However, a few years ago, the MOL was replaced with the Maximum Order (MO). In accordance with FAR 8.404(b)(3), the maximum order threshold represents the point where it is advantageous for customers to seek a price reduction. When ordering facilities meet or exceed this level, contractors can offer a lower price, offer the current contract price, or decline the order. These new procedures have been developed to allow FSS contractors to accept orders of any size. Thus, customer orders are no longer restricted by a maximum order limitation. In fact, for orders exceeding this threshold, after a customer reviews the pricelist(s) or General Services Administration *Advantage!*, the FAR instructs customers to generally seek price reductions from schedule contractor(s) appearing to provide the best value (considering price and other factors).

ORDERING PROCEDURES FOR SERVICES (REQUIRING A STATEMENT OF WORK)

FAR 8.402 contemplates that GSA may occasionally find it necessary to establish special ordering procedures for individual Federal Supply Schedules or for some Special Item Numbers (SINs) within a Schedule. GSA has established special ordering procedures for services that require a Statement of Work. These special ordering procedures take precedence over the procedures in FAR 8.404 (b)(2) through (b)(3).

GSA has determined that the prices for services contained in the contractor's price list applicable to this Schedule are fair and reasonable. However, the ordering office using this contract is responsible for considering the level of effort and mix of labor proposed to perform a specific task being ordered and for making a determination that the total firm-fixed price or ceiling price is fair and reasonable.

(a) When ordering services, ordering offices shall—

(1) Prepare a Request (Request for Quote or other communication tool):

- (i) A statement of work (a performance-based statement of work is preferred) that outlines, at a minimum, the work to be performed, location of work, period of performance, deliverable schedule, applicable standards, acceptance criteria, and any special requirements (i.e., security clearances, travel, special knowledge, etc.) should be prepared.
- (ii) The request should include the statement of work and request the contractors to submit either a firm-fixed price or a ceiling price to provide the services outlined in the statement of work. A firm-fixed price order shall be requested, unless the ordering office makes a determination that it is not possible at the time of placing the order to estimate accurately the extent or duration of the work or to anticipate cost with any reasonable degree of confidence. When such a determination is made, a labor hour or time-and-materials proposal may be requested. The firm-fixed price shall be based on the prices in the schedule contract and shall consider the mix of labor categories and level of effort required to perform the services described in the statement of work. The firm-fixed price of the order should also include any travel costs or other direct charges related to performance of the services ordered, unless the order provides for reimbursement of travel costs at the rates provided in the Federal Travel or Joint Travel Regulations. A ceiling price must be established for labor-hour and time-and-materials orders.
- (iii) The request may ask the contractors, if necessary or appropriate, to submit a project plan for performing the task, and information on the contractor's experience and/or past performance performing similar tasks.
- (iv) The request shall notify the contractors what basis will be used for selecting the contractor to receive the order. The notice shall include the basis for determining whether the contractors are technically qualified and provide an explanation regarding the intended use of any experience and/or past performance information in determining technical qualification of responses.

(2) Transmit the Request to Contractors:

- (i) Based upon an initial evaluation of catalogs and price lists, the ordering office should identify the contractors that appear to offer the best value (considering the scope of services offered, pricing and other factors such as contractors' locations, as appropriate).
- (ii) The request should be provided to three (3) contractors if the proposed order is estimated to exceed the micro-purchase threshold, but not exceed the maximum order threshold. For proposed orders exceeding the maximum order threshold, the request should be provided to additional contractors that offer services that will meet the agency's needs. Ordering offices should strive to minimize the contractors' costs associated with responding to requests for quotes for specific orders. Requests should be tailored to the minimum level necessary for adequate evaluation and selection for order placement. Oral presentations should be considered, when possible.

ORDERING PROCEDURES FOR SERVICES - CONTINUED

(3) Evaluate Responses and Select the Contractor to Receive the Order:

After responses have been evaluated against the factors identified in the request, the order should be placed with the schedule contractor that represents the best value. (See FAR 8.404)

(b) The establishment of Federal Supply Schedule Blanket Purchase Agreements (BPAs) for recurring services is permitted when the procedures outlined herein are followed. All BPAs for services must define the services that may be ordered under the BPA, along with delivery or performance time frames, billing procedures, etc. The potential volume of orders under BPAs, regardless of the size of individual orders, may offer the ordering office the opportunity to secure volume discounts. When establishing BPAs, ordering offices shall—

(1) Inform contractors in the request (based on the agency's requirement) if a single BPA or multiple BPAs will be established, and indicate the basis that will be used for selecting the contractors to be awarded the BPAs.

(i) **SINGLE BPA:** Generally, a single BPA should be established when the ordering office can define the tasks to be ordered under the BPA and establish a firm-fixed price or ceiling price for individual tasks or services to be ordered. When this occurs, authorized users may place the order directly under the established BPA when the need for service arises. The schedule contractor that represents the best value should be awarded the BPA. (See FAR 8.404)

(ii) **MULTIPLE BPAs:** When the ordering office determines multiple BPAs are needed to meet its requirements, the ordering office should determine which contractors can meet any technical qualifications before establishing the BPAs. When multiple BPAs are established, the authorized users must follow the procedures in (a)(2)(ii) above and then place the order with the Schedule contractor that represents the best value.

(2) **Review BPAs Periodically:** Such reviews shall be conducted at least annually. The purpose of the review is to determine whether the BPA still represents the best value. (See FAR 8.404)

(c) The ordering office should give preference to small business concerns when two or more contractors can provide the services at the same firm-fixed price or ceiling price.

(d) When the ordering office's requirement involves both products as well as executive, administrative and/or professional, services, the ordering office should total the prices for the products and the firm-fixed price for the services and select the contractor that represents the best value. (See FAR 8.404)

(e) The ordering office, at a minimum, should document orders by identifying the contractor from which the services were purchased, the services purchased, and the amount paid. If other than a firm-fixed price order is placed, such documentation should include the basis for the determination to use a labor-hour or time-and-materials order. For agency requirements in excess of the micro-purchase threshold, the order file should document the evaluation of Schedule contractors' quotes that formed the basis for the selection of the contractor that received the order and the rationale for any trade-offs made in making the selection.
