STATEMENT OF NEEDS

The field of psychopharmacology is rapidly expanding. This activity was developed to provide practical tips on advances in the use of psychotropic medication for practicing clinicians. The update will focus on developments in the past year that are relevant to clinicians who treat psychiatric disorders, to include complicated depression, bipolar disorder, and the use of medication in the medically ill or pregnant patient.

EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

1. discuss changes in psychiatric prescribing necessary in the context of comorbid medical illness
2. identify drug interactions when prescribing psychotropic medications
3. discuss the role of three pharmacologic treatments for substance abuse disorders.
4. evaluate risks and benefits when prescribing psychiatric medications in pregnancy and for the prevention and treatment of postpartum depression
5. discuss three options for the treatment of resistant depression
