PERSON CLASS FILE TAXONOMY

1. PURPOSE: This Veterans Health Administration (VHA) Directive establishes policy for assigning providers in the Person Class File; it describes and outlines the provider classification system developed by the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) and the Health Care Financing Administration (HCFA), internationally and nationally recognized standard-setting organizations.

2. BACKGROUND

a. VHA began assigning the Person Class with the implementation of the Ambulatory Care Data Capture initiative in October of 1996. ANSI and the HCFA National Provider System Workgroup developed a Provider Classification System which codified provider types and provider areas of specialization for all medical-related providers. This taxonomy was developed primarily to codify providers for billing purposes. The taxonomy list incorporates all types of providers associated with medical care in various ways. Many support equipment/machinery or repair (such as technologists, technicians); a number of the providers provide medical services in concert with others and do not or cannot bill independently for their portion. The focus of this taxonomy is on medical providers who are licensed practitioners, those who bill for health-related services rendered, and inclusive for all those who appeared on the Medicare HCFA Provider Specialty listing. This includes primarily providers who are licensed to practice medicine via State Licensure Agencies and a very broad definition of "areas of specialization" that includes nationally-recognized specialties, provider self-designated specialties, and areas of practice focus. This level of detail captures specialty information in categories detailed enough to support trading credentialing information and yet broad enough to support specialization information. It provides:

- (1) Descriptions and definitions of health care providers and employees.
- (2) The taxonomy and definitions in a table format.
- (3) A table comparison of the old person class taxonomy and their mapping to the new format and definitions.

b. **Taxonomy Structure.** The provider classification system adopted by VHA is hierarchical and classifies providers into aggregate groupings around services, provider types, and areas of specialization or focus. The taxonomy represents a one-to-many relationship to the individual provider. Many occurrences of the taxonomy may apply to a single entity or provider. A provider who trains in Internal Medicine and specializes in Cardiology may appear with specialties in both Internal Medicine and Cardiology (two occurrences of the taxonomy relating to one provider). VHA assigns only one-person class to each provider and in the example above, Cardiology would be the assigned Person Class.

c. The hierarchy of provider categories incorporates four areas of provider classifications that, when used in concert with one another, create the capability to sort providers into broad and specific categories. The hierarchy is:

(1) **Provider Type**

(a) A code that identifies a major grouping of service(s) or occupation(s) of health care providers.

(b) Example: Dental Service Providers, Dietary and Nutritional Service Providers.

(2) **Classification Code**

(a) A code that identifies more specific services(s) or occupation(s) within the health care provider type. The coding is based on licensed provider classifications.

(b) Example: Within Dental Service Providers, there are Dentists, Dental Hygienists, and Dental Laboratory Technicians.

(3) **Area of Specialization.** A code that identifies the provider's specialization, a segment of the population that a health care provider chooses to service, a specific medical service, a specialization in treating a specific disease, or any other descriptive characteristic about the provider's practice relating to the services rendered.

(4) **Trainee Categories**

(a) The Person Class File provides seven trainee categories. These categories may be added as secondary providers, and the supervising practitioner should be recorded as the primary provider for all patient care episodes. The categories are:

(b) Resident person class assignments are to be limited only to the two resident classifications, numbers 144 and 145, and are not reflective of the teaching physician specialty.

(5) **Definitions Documents.** Attachment A provides descriptions and definitions of health care providers. Attachment B provides a table comparison of the old person class taxonomy and their mapping to the new format and definitions.

3. POLICY: It is VHA policy that VHA will utilize data definitions published by ANSI and HCFA.

4. ACTION

a. **Facility Director.** The facility Director, or Chief Executive Officer, is responsible for the implementation of, and compliance with the requirements of this directive.

(1) Each provider must be assigned to the Person Class File according to the definitions provided in Attachment A.

(2) The Person Class File must be reviewed and updated at least annually.

(3) As providers enter and/or leave employment the Person Class File must be edited to reflect the appropriate status. The specialty and credentials of the provider are required for VHA clinical encounter reporting and to meet HCFA billing requirements.

(4) All medical providers must be assigned a Person Class designation.

b. **Chief of Staff.** The Chief of Staff is responsible for assuring that each health care provider is assigned to the Person Class File according to the health care provider's credentials and privileges to the highest level of specificity, as outlined in this directive.

c. **Program Office.** Each organizational unit at the facility level must ensure that all providers are assigned to an appropriate person class reflective of their position from the table and definitions provided in the appendices.

ATTACHMENT A

PERSON CLASS DEFINITIONS

1. Acupuncturist. An acupuncturist is a person who has completed an education training program, is certified in acupuncture, and performs ancient therapy for alleviation of pain, anesthesia and treatment of some diseases. Acupuncturists use long, fine needles inserted into specific points in order to treat painful conditions or produce anesthesia.

2. Art Therapist

a. An individual who uses art to achieve the therapeutic goals of symptom relief, emotional integration, and recovery from or adjustment to illness or disability. *Source: Lexikon: Dictionary of Health Care Terms, Organizations and Acronyms for the Era of Reform, The Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations, Oakbrook Terrace, Illinois: 1994, p. 107.*

b. An art therapist uses a form of treatment that enables patients with mental or physical disabilities to use art as a way of expressing and dealing with feelings and inner conflicts. *Source: Art Therapy Program, Marymount College, Tarrytown, NY.*

c. An individual who uses arts modalities and creative processes during intentional intervention in therapeutic, rehabilitative, community, or educational settings to foster health, communication, and expression; promote the integration of physical, emotional, cognitive, and social functioning; enhance self-awareness; and facilitate change. *Source: National Coalition of Arts.*

3. Assistant, Podiatric. An individual who assists a podiatrist in tasks, such as exposing and developing x-rays; taking and recording patient histories; assisting in biomechanical evaluations and negative castings; preparing and sterilizing instruments and equipment; providing the patient with postoperative instructions; applying surgical dressings; preparing the patient for treatment, padding, and strapping; and performing routine office procedures. *Source: Lexikon: Dictionary of Health Care Terms, Organizations and Acronyms for the Era of Reform, The Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations, Oakbrook Terrace, Illinois: 1994, p. 622.*

4. Audiologist

a. A specialist in evaluation, habilitation, and rehabilitation of those whose communication disorders center in whole or in part in hearing function. Audiologists are autonomous professionals who identify, assess, and manage disorders of the auditory, balance and other neural systems. Audiologists provide audiological (aural) rehabilitation to children and adults across the entire age span. Audiologists select, fit, and dispense amplification systems such as hearing aids and related devices. *Source: American Speech-Language-Hearing Association, (1996, Spring) Scope of Practice in Audiology, p. 2.*

b. An audiologist is a person qualified by a Master's Degree in Audiology, licensed by the state, where applicable, and practicing within the scope of that license. Audiologists evaluate and treat patients with impaired hearing. They plan, direct, and conduct rehabilitative programs with auditory substitutional devices (hearing aids) and other therapy.

5. Audiologist-Hearing Aid Fitter. An audiologist or hearing aid fitter is the professional who specializes in evaluating and treating people with hearing loss, conducts a wide variety of tests to determine the exact nature of an individual's hearing problem, presents a variety of treatment options to patients, dispenses and fits hearing aids, administers tests of balance to evaluate dizziness and provides hearing rehabilitation training. This classification should be used where individuals are licensed as "audiologist-hearing aid fitters" as opposed to states that license individuals as "audiologists." *Source: American Academy of Audiology, 1735 N. 6. Behavioral Health and Social Service Providers. Broad classification aggregating providers who are trained and educated to perform services related to behavioral health, mental health, and counseling; and may be licensed or practice within the scope, licensure, or training.

7. Chiropractor. A provider qualified by a Doctor of Chiropractic (D.C.), licensed by the state and who practices chiropractic medicine -- that discipline within the healing arts which deals with the nervous system and its relationship to the spinal column and its interrelationship with other body systems.

8. Christian Science Practitioner or Nurse. A practitioner listed and certified by The First Church of Christ, Scientist, Boston, MA. *Source: Paraphrased from Title 42 Code of Federal Regulations Section 440.170.*

9. Clinical Nurse Specialist. A registered nurse who, through a graduate degree program in nursing, or through a formal post-basic education program or continuing education courses and clinical experience, is expert in a specialty area of nursing practice within one or more of the components of direct patient and/or client care, consultation, education, research, and administration. *Sources: American Nurses Association, American Nurses Credentialing Center, 1996 Certification Catalogue and The Interagency Conference on Nursing Statistics.*

10. Contractor. A person who contracts to supply certain materials or do certain work for a stipulated sum; e.g., one whose business is contracting work in any of the building trades. For purposes of the taxonomy, a person who contracts to complete home repairs or modifications to accommodate a health condition (e.g., wheelchair ramp, and kitchen counter lowering). *Source: Webster's New World Dictionary of the American Language, Second College Edition, William Collins and World Publishing Co., Inc., New York: 1974, p. 308.*

11. Counselor. A provider who is trained and educated in the performance of behavior health services through interpersonal communications and analysis. Training and education at the specialty level usually requires a Master's Degree and clinical experience and supervision for licensure or certification. *Source: Abridged from definitions provided by the National Board of Certified Counselors and the American Association of Pastoral Counselors.*

12. Dance Therapist. The dance therapist, sometimes called a movement therapist, focuses on rhythmic body movements as a medium of physical and psychological change. Dance therapy is practiced more often with mental health patients than with physically-disabled patients. A Master's Degree is required by the American Dance Therapy Association to award the credentials Dance Therapist Registered (DTR). *Source: Joel A. DeLisa and Bruce M. Gans,*

13. Dental Assistant. An individual who assists at the chair side in a dental operatory, performs reception and clerical functions, and does dental radiograph and selected dental laboratory procedures under the direction and supervision of a dentist. Post-high school education is not required, but many dental assistants are graduates of 1- or 2-year post-high school education programs accredited by the Commission on Dental Accreditation. The dentists who employ them train the balance of dental assistants. *Source: Rhea, Ott, and Shafritz, The Facts on File Dictionary of Health Care Management, New York: Facts on File Publications, 1988.*

14. Dental Hygienist. A preventive health professional who has graduated from an accredited dental hygiene program in an institution of higher education, is licensed in dental hygiene, and who provides educational, clinical, research, administrative, and therapeutic services supporting total health through the promotion of optimal oral health. *Source: American Dental Hygienist Association.*

15. Dental Laboratory. A laboratory specializing in the construction of dental appliances that conform to a dentist's specifications including the construction of dentures (complete or partial), orthodontic appliances, bridgework, crowns, inlays, etc. *Source: Lexikon: Dictionary of Health Care Terms, Organizations and Acronyms for the Era of Reform, The Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations, Oakbrook Terrace, Illinois: 1994, p. 1245.*

16. Dental Laboratory Technician. An individual trained or educated to perform one or more phases of the dental laboratory procedures required in the creation of a dental prosthetic, fabricated under a dental prescription (work authorization). *Source: National Board for Certification in Dental Laboratory Technology.*

17. Dental Service Provider. Broad category to identify independent practitioners licensed by the state who render services related to the practice of dentistry. The practice of dentistry means the diagnosis, treatment, prescription, or operation for a disease, pain, deformity, deficiency, injury or physical condition of the human tooth, teeth, alveolar process, gums or jaws, or their dependent tissues, or an offer, undertaking, attempt to do, or holding oneself out to do any other of these acts.

18. Dentist. A dentist is a person qualified by a Doctorate in Dental Surgery (D.D.S.) or Dental Medicine (D.M.D.) licensed by the state to practice dentistry, and practicing within the scope of that license. Many dentists are general practitioners who handle a wide variety of dental needs. Other dentists practice in one of eight specialty areas recognized by the American Dental Association: oral and maxillofacial surgery, orthodontics, periodontics, prosthodontics, endodontics, public health, oral pathology, pediatric dentistry, and dental radiology.

19. Dietary and Nutritional Service Provider. Broad category defining practitioners who help prevent and treat illness by promoting healthy eating habits, scientifically evaluating diets and suggesting modifications. They may also assess the nutritional needs of patients, develop, and implement nutritional care plans.

20. Dietary Manager. A dietary manager is a trained food services professional who is charged with maintaining cost and profit objectives, purchasing foods and services for the department and supervising staff. Dietary managers are trained to understand the basic nutritional needs of clients and work in partnership with dietitians, who offer specialized nutritional expertise. The certified dietary manager (CDM) designation is an advanced professional credential awarded to dietary managers who have completed specific course work, have passed the national credentialing exams (including a sanitation and safety exam), and have applied for certification.

21. Dietetic Technician, Registered. A person trained in food and nutrition that is an integral part of health care and food service management teams. A dietetic technician, registered (DTR) has successfully completed at least a 2-year associate's degree at a United States regionally-accredited college or university; a dietetic technician program approved by The American Dietetic Association (ADA), including 450 hours of supervised practice experience; a national examination administered by the Commission on Dietetic Registration; and continuing professional educational requirements to maintain registration. *Source: ADA, Becoming a Dietetic Technician, Registered -- a Food and Nutrition Practitioner, Chicago, IL: The American Dietetic Association, July 1997.*

22. Dietitian, Registered. A registered dietician (RD) is a food and nutrition expert who has successfully completed a minimum of a bachelor's degree at a United States regionally-accredited university or college and course work approved by the ADA; an ADA-accredited or approved, supervised practice program, typically 6 to 12 months in length; a national examination administered by the Commission on Dietetic Registration; and continuing professional educational requirements to maintain registration. *Source: ADA, Becoming a Registered Dietitian – a Food and Nutrition Expert, Chicago, IL: The ADA, July 1997.*

23. Driver. A person employed to operate a motor vehicle as a carrier of persons or property.

24. Durable Medical Equipment and Medical Supplies. A supplier of medical equipment such as respirators, wheelchairs, home dialysis systems, or monitoring systems, that are prescribed by a physician for a patient's use in the home and that are usable for an extended period of time.

25. Emergency Medical Service Provider. Broad category for individuals who complete additional training and education in the area of pre-hospital emergency services and are licensed and/or practice within the scope of that training.

26. Emergency Medical Technician, Basic. A Basic EMT is an individual trained and certified to perform basic life support treatment in medical emergencies based on individual state boards. *Source: Tabers Medical Dictionary and Florida EMS Clearinghouse.*

27. Emergency Medical Technician, Intermediate. An Intermediate EMT is an individual trained and certified to perform intermediate life support treatment in medical emergencies based on individual state boards. *Sources: Tabers Medical Dictionary and Florida EMS Clearinghouse.*

28. Emergency Medical Technician, Paramedic. An EMT, Paramedic is an individual trained and certified to perform advanced life support (ALS) in medical emergencies based on individual state boards. *Sources: Tabers Medical Dictionary and Florida EMS Clearinghouse.*

29. Hearing Instrument Specialist. Individuals who test hearing for the selection, adaptation, fitting, adjusting, servicing, and sale of hearing aids. Hearing Instrument Specialist is a

designation provided individuals who qualify by the National Hearing Aid Society. *Source: Code of Federal Regulations #45, Part 96, and Appendix A, Uniform Definition of Services.*

30. Home Health Aide. A person trained to assist public health nurses, home health nurses, and other health professionals in the bedside care of patients in their homes. *Source: Rhea, Ott, and Shafritz, The Facts on File Dictionary of Health Care Management, New York: Facts on File Publications, 1988.*

31. Homemaker. A person who, under the supervision of a home health or welfare agency, assists elderly, ill, and disabled persons by providing services intended to preserve independent living and normal family life; frequently, household chores such as cooking and cleaning. *Source: Rhea, Ott, and Shafritz, The Facts on File Dictionary of Health Care Management, New York: Facts on File Publications, 1988.*

32. Homeopath. A provider who is educated and trained in a system of therapeutics in which diseases are treated by drugs which are capable of producing in healthy persons symptoms like those of the disease to be treated. Treatment requires administering a drug in minute doses. *Source: Dorland's Illustrated Medical Dictionary, 26th edition, Philadelphia: W.B. Saunders Company, 1981.*

33. Kinesiotherapist. A provider trained and educated in the applied science of medically-prescribed therapeutic exercise, education, and adapted physical activities designed to improve the quality of life and health of adults and children by developing physical fitness, increasing mobility and independence, and improving psychosocial behavior. The kinesiotherapist seeks a coach-player relationship in which the kinesiotherapist helps the patient or client reach the goal of becoming an independent, self-sustaining person. Kinesiotherapists, as compared with physical therapists, put more emphasis on geriatric care, reconditioning and fitness, and psychiatric care. A large percentage of kinesiotherapists practice in Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) facilities. *Source: The Kinesiotherapy Association.*

34. Legal Medicine. The specialty areas of medicine concerned with matters of, and relations with, substantive law and legal institutions; such as: the conduct of medical examinations at crime scenes, performance of autopsies, giving of expert medical testimony in judicial proceedings, medical treatment of inmates of penal institutions, the practice of trauma medicine in law enforcement settings, other clinical practice, and medical science applications in the fields of law, law enforcement, and corrections. *Source: Rhea, Ott, and Shafritz, The Facts on File Dictionary of Health Care Management, New York: Facts on File Publications, 1988.*

35. Licensed Practical Nurse. An individual with post-high school vocational training and practical experience in the provision of nursing care at a level less than that required for certification as a registered nurse. Requirements for education experience, licensure, and job responsibilities vary among the states. *Source: Rhea, Ott, and Shafritz, The Facts on File Dictionary of Health Care Management, New York: Facts on File Publications, 1988.*

36. Licensed Vocational Nurse. An individual with post-high school vocational training and practical experience in the provision of nursing care at a level less than that required for certification as a registered nurse. **NOTE:** *This can also be an alternate term for licensed*

practical nurse arising from difference in occupational titles between states and post-high school training programs and institutions. Requirements for education experience, licensure, and job responsibilities vary among the states. Source: Rhea, Ott, and Shafritz, The Facts on File Dictionary of Health Care Management, New York: Facts on File Publications, 1988.

37. Marriage and Family Therapist. A mental health provider, e.g., social worker, psychologist, etc., who concentrates their practice on the social, emotional, and psychological treatment of married couples and families.

38. Massage Therapist. An individual trained in the manipulation of tissues (as by rubbing, stroking, kneading, or tapping) with the hand or an instrument for remedial or hygienic purposes.

39. Medical Records Administrator. A common and somewhat archaic term for a Registered Record Administrator, who is an individual with specialized education as a health information specialist and manager of medical records and data with functional responsibilities in the management, privacy protection, and interpretation of data for patient care, research, statistical reporting, and planning. Certification requires a Bachelor's Degree from an accredited college program and passing of a national certification examination. *Source: American Health Information Management Association, Chicago, IL, 1996.*

40. Midwife, Certified. A provider educated in the independent management of women's health and focusing particularly on pregnancy, childbirth, the post-partum period, care of the newborn, family planning, and gynecological needs of women. Certification requires education at the post-graduate level in nursing or an allied professional health care field. *Source: The American College of Nurse-Midwives, Standards for the Practice of Nurse-Midwifery, Washington, DC, 1992.*

41. Midwife, Lay (non-nurse). A person qualified by experience and limited specialized training to provide obstetric and neo-natal care in the management of women having normal pregnancy, labor, and childbirth. The lay midwife is licensed in some states.

42. Music Therapist. The music therapist works with patients with a broad variety of diagnoses and therapeutic goals. The interventions may involve musical performance with instruments, voice or body movements; listening to music; or attending musical events. *Source: Joel A. DeLisa and Bruce M. Gans, Rehabilitation Medicine: Principles and Practice Second Edition, J.B. Lippincott Company, Philadelphia: 1993, p. 9-11.*

43. Naturopath. An individual who practices naturopathy, a system of therapeutics in which neither surgical nor medicinal agents are used, dependence being placed only on natural (non-medicinal) forces.

44. Neuropsychologist. An individual with a doctorate degree, licensure in clinical psychology and specialized training or board certification in neuropsychology, who practices or adheres to the principles of neuropsychology; a specialty within the field of psychology focusing primarily on neurobehavioral functioning. *Source: American Psychological Association, Washington, DC, 1997.*

45. Nurse Anesthetist, Certified Registered

a. A licensed registered nurse with advanced specialty education in anesthesia who, in collaboration with appropriate health care professionals, provides pre-operative, intra-operative, and post-operative care to patients and assists in management and resuscitation of critical

patients in intensive care, coronary care, and emergency situations. Nurse anesthetists are certified following successful completion of credentials, state licensure review, and a national examination directed by the Council on Certification of Nurse Anesthetists. *Sources: Council on Certification of Nurse Anesthetists, Park Ridge, IL, and Rhea, Ott, and Shafritz, The Facts on File Dictionary of Health Care Management, New York: Facts on File Publications, 1988.*

b. A registered nurse who is qualified by special training to administer anesthesia in collaboration with a physician or dentist and who can assist in the care of patients who are in critical condition. *Source: Lexikon: Dictionary of Health Care Terms, Organizations and Acronyms for the Era of Reform, The Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations, Oakbrook Terrace, Illinois: 1994, p. 548.*

46. Nursing Service Providers. Providers who are trained and educated to perform services in health promotion, disease prevention, acute and chronic care, and restoration of health, and health maintenance across the life span. *Source: American Nurses Association, American Nurses Credentialing Center, 1996 Certification Catalog.*

47. Nurse Practitioner

a. A registered nurse provider with a graduate degree in nursing prepared for advanced practice involving independent and interdependent decision making and direct accountability for clinical judgment across the health care continuum or in a certified specialty. *Source: American Nurses' Association, American Nurses Credentialing Center, 1996 Certification Catalogue.*

b. A registered nurse who has completed additional training beyond basic nursing education and who provides primary health care services in accordance with state nurse practice laws or statutes. Tasks performed by nurse practitioners vary with practice requirements mandated by geographic, political, economic, and social factors. Nurse practitioner specialists include, but are not limited to, family nurse practitioners, gerontological nurse practitioners, pediatric nurse practitioners, obstetric-gynecologic nurse practitioners, and school nurse practitioners. *Source: Lexikon: Dictionary of Health Care Terms, Organizations and Acronyms for the Era of Reform, The Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations, Oakbrook Terrace, Illinois: 1994, p. 549.*

48. Nurse's Aide

a. An unlicensed individual who is trained to function in an assistive role to the licensed nurse in the provision of patient and/or client activities as delegated by the nurse. *Source: American Nurses Association, Registered Professional Nurses and Unlicensed Personnel, 2nd Edition., 1996.*

b. An individual trained (either on-the-job or through a formal course generally of less than 1 year) and experienced in performing patient or client-care nursing tasks that do not require the skills of a specialist, technician, or professional. Examples of tasks performed by nurses aides include changing clothes, diapers, and beds; assisting patients to perform exercises or personal hygiene tasks; and supporting communication or social interaction. Specific education and

49. Nursing Home Administrator. An individual, often licensed by the state, who is responsible for the management of a nursing home. *Source: Lexikon: Dictionary of Health Care Terms, Organizations, and Acronyms for the Era of Reform, Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations, Oakbrook Terrace, IL, 1994, p. 552.*

50. Nursing Service Related Providers. Providers who are trained and educated to perform and administer services related to health promotion, disease prevention, acute and chronic care, spiritual guidance and comfort for healing and health, restoration of health and health maintenance across the life span. *Source: American Nurses Association, American Nurses Credentialing Center, 1996 Certification Catalogue, p. 5.*

51. Nutritionist

a. A specialist in adapting and applying food and nutrient knowledge to the solution of food and nutritional problems, the control of disease, and the promotion of health. Nutritionists perform research, instruct groups and individuals about nutritional requirements, and assist people in developing meal patterns that meet their nutritional needs. *Source: Rhea, Ott, and Shafritz, The Facts on File Dictionary of Health Care Management, New York: Facts on File Publications, 1988.*

b. A nutritionist is someone who has completed undergraduate and/or graduate training in the discipline of nutrition without necessarily meeting the academic and experience requirements to qualify for the Registered Dietitian designation.

52. Occupational Therapist. An occupational therapist is a person qualified by completion of an approved program in occupational therapy, licensed by the state and practicing within the scope of that license, or where licensure does not exist, certified by the American Occupational Therapy Certification Board. An occupational therapist evaluates the self-care, work and leisure performance skills of well and disabled clients and plans and implements programs to restore, develop or maintain the task performance skills necessary for daily living and for the client's particular occupational role.

53. Occupational Therapy Assistant. An Occupational Therapy assistant provides medically prescribed occupational therapy services under the supervision of a registered occupational therapist to promote rehabilitation of patients in the hospital, home, schools, and other settings; has completed a 2-year associate degree or one of the limited number of certificate programs; has met the qualifications as determined by the representative assembly and thus is entitled to use the term Certified occupational therapy assistant. *Source: Valerie Walker, COTA Program Specialist, Practice Dept., Chronicle Guidance publications, American Occupational Therapy Association.*

54. Optometrist. Doctors of Optometry (O.D.) are independent primary health care providers who examine, diagnose, treat, and manage diseases and disorders of the visual systems, the eye, and associated structures, as well as diagnose related, systemic conditions. An optometrist typically completes 4 years of Baccalaureate training and 4 years of optometry training. Residency training of 1 or 2 years is training received after attainment of the Optometry Degree.

55. Orthotist. An individual skilled in the practice, making, use, and application to individual cases of an orthopedic appliance or apparatus used to support, align, prevent or correct

deformities or to improve the function of movable parts of the body. *Source: Dorland's Illustrated Medical Dictionary, 26th Edition, Philadelphia: W. Saunders Company, 1981.*

56. Orthotics or Prosthetics Fitter

a. An individual who, under the guidance of and in consultation with the orthotist or prosthetist, fabricates orthotics and/or prosthetics in such a manner as to provide maximum fit, function, cosmesis, and workmanship.

b. An individual who, under the direction of a orthotist or prothetist, follows prescriptions and specifications to determine a device, such as a brace, to be made and the materials and tools needed to make the device. A technician then develops the devices. *Source: Lexikon: Dictionary of Health Care Terms, Organizations and Acronyms for the Era of Reform, The Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations, Oakbrook Terrace, Illinois: 1994, p. 576.*

57. Other Service Providers. Providers not otherwise classified, who perform or administer services in or related to the delivery or research of health care services, disease, and restoration of health. An individual provider who is not represented in one of the identified categories, but whose data may be needed for clinical, operational or administrative processes.

58. Pharmacist. An individual who is licensed to prepare and sell or dispense drugs and compounds and to make up prescriptions. *Source: Dorland's Illustrated Medical Dictionary, 26th Edition, Philadelphia: W. Saunders Company, 1981.*

59. Pharmacy Service Providers. A broad category grouping providers who render services relating to the preparation and dispensing of drugs.

60. Physical Therapist

a. Physical therapists (PT) are health care professionals who evaluate and treat people with health problems resulting from injury or disease. PTs assess joint motion, muscle strength and endurance, function of heart and lungs, and performance of activities required in daily living, among other responsibilities. Treatment includes therapeutic exercises, cardiovascular endurance training, and training in activities of daily living.

b. A physical therapist is a person qualified by an accredited program in physical therapy, licensed by the state, and practicing within the scope of that license. Physical therapists treat disease, injury, or loss of a bodily part by physical means, such as the application of light, heat, cold, water, electricity, massage, and exercise. They develop treatment plans based upon each patient's strengths, weaknesses, and range of motion and ability to function.

c. A health professional who specializes in physical therapy in the health care field concerned primarily with the treatment of disorders with physical agents and methods, such as massage, manipulation, therapeutic exercises, cold, heat (including short-wave, microwave, and ultrasonic diathermy), hydrotherapy, electric stimulation and light to assist in rehabilitating patients and in restoring normal function after an illness or injury. *Source: Lexikon: Dictionary of Health Care*

61. Physical Therapy Assistant

a. Physical therapist assistants (PTA) are skilled health care providers who are graduates of a physical therapist assistant associate degree program accredited by an agency recognized by the Secretary of the U.S. Department of Education or Council on Post-secondary Accreditation, who assists the physical therapist in providing physical therapy. The supervising physical therapist is directly responsible for the actions of the physical therapist assistant. The PTA performs physical therapy procedures and related tasks that have been selected and delegated by the supervising physical therapist. Duties of the PTA include assisting the physical therapist in implementing treatment programs, training patients in exercise and activities of daily living, conducting treatments, and reporting to the physical therapist on the patient's responses. In addition to direct patient care, the PTA may also perform such functions as patient transport, and clinic or equipment preparation and maintenance. Currently, more than half of all states require PTAs to be licensed, registered or certified. *Source: American Physical Therapy Association, P.O. Box 37257, Washington, DC 20013.*

b. An individual who works under the supervision of a physical therapist to assist the individual in providing physical therapy services. A physical therapy assistant may, for instance, help patients follow an appropriate exercise program that will increase their strength, endurance, coordination, and range of motion and train patients to perform activities of daily life. *Source: Lexikon: Dictionary of Health Care Terms, Organizations and Acronyms for the Era of Reform, Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations, Oakbrook Terrace, IL: 1994, p. 612.*

62. Physician Assistants (PA). PAs are health professionals certified by a employer to practice medicine as delegated by a supervising physician. They must be graduates of a nationally-accredited PA Program and must pass a national exam developed in cooperation with the National Board of Medical Examiners. As part of their comprehensive responsibilities, PAs perform physical exams, diagnose illnesses, develop and carry out treatment plans, order and interpret laboratory tests, suture lacerations, apply casts, assist in surgery, provide patient education and preventive health care counseling, and prescribe medications under their own signature. *Source: American Academy of Physician Assistants, Alexandria, VA.*

63. Advanced Practice Nursing Providers. Providers trained, educated at a post-graduate level, and certified to perform autonomous and specialized roles as nurse practitioners, midwives, nurse anesthetists, or clinical nurse specialists. *Source: The Interagency Conference on Nursing Statistics.*

64. Physician (M.D. and D.O.). A broad category grouping state licensed providers in allopathic or osteopathic medicine whose scope of practice is determined by education.

65. Physician and/or Osteopath. A physician is a person qualified by a doctorate in medicine (M.D.) or osteopathy (D.O.), licensed by the state, and practicing within the scope of that license. A physician generally has primary responsibility for the health care of the patient. While M.D.s and D.O.s may use all accepted methods of treatment, including drugs and surgery, D.O.s place special emphasis on the body's musculoskeletal systems.

66. Physicians (Other Roles). A state-licensed provider in allopathic or osteopathic medicine who performs services in a role defined independently of the scope of medical practice. *Source: Abridged from the definition of physician.*

67. Podiatric Medicine and Surgery Provider. Broad category grouping licensed providers that renders services related to the human foot.

68. Podiatrist. A podiatrist is a person qualified by a Doctor of Podiatric Medicine (D.P.M.) degree, licensed by the state, and practicing within the scope of that license. Podiatrists diagnose and treat foot and ankle diseases and deformities. They perform medical, surgical, and other operative procedures, prescribe corrective devices and prescribe and administer drugs and physical therapy.

69. Prosthetist. An individual skilled in the practice, making, use, and application to individual cases of an artificial substitute for a missing body part, such as an arm or leg, eye or tooth, used for functional or cosmetic reasons, or both. *Source: Dorland's Illustrated Medical Dictionary, 26th Edition, Philadelphia: W.B. Saunders Company, 1981.*

70. Psychoanalyst

a. A practitioner of psychoanalysis employs methods to elicit past emotional experiences and their role in influencing the current mental life of patients, in order to discover the conflicts and mechanisms by which their pathologic mental state has been produced and to furnish hints for psychotherapeutic procedures. The methods employ free association, recall, and interpretation of dreams and interpretation of transference and resistance phenomena. *Sources: Dorlands Illustrated Medical Dictionary, 28th Edition, W.B. Saunders Company: Philadelphia, 1994, p. 1382.*

b. An individual who is educated with a doctoral degree in psychoanalysis or psychology, trained at an established psychoanalytic institute, and practices or adheres to the principles of psychoanalysis. Psychoanalysis is a form of psychotherapy and a system of investigation for determining and understanding mental processes, which was originally conceived by Sigmund Freud. Psychoanalysis involves the analysis and interpretation of dreams, resistances, and transferences, and uses free association and catharsis. Clinical practice requires licensure. *Sources: American Psychological Association, Washington, DC, 1997, and Rhea, Ott, and Shafritz, The Facts on File Dictionary of Health Care Management, New York: Facts on File Publications, 1988.*

71. Psychologist. An individual who specializes in psychological research, testing, and/or therapy. Psychology is the branch of science that deals with mental processes and behavior, composed of the following major fields: abnormal, clinical, comparative, counseling, developmental, educational, engineering, experimental, industrial, learning, motivation, perception, personality, physiological, psychometrics, school, and social psychology. *Source: Lexikon: Dictionary of Health Care Terms, Organizations and Acronyms for the Era of Reform, The Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations, Oakbrook Terrace, Illinois: 1994, p. 654.*

72. Pulmonary Function Technologist. An individual who is trained and qualified in the techniques and procedures for assessment and treatment of diseases of the lungs and airways such as pneumonia, cancer, pleurisy, asthma, bronchitis, emphysema, and other disorders. Therapy involves assessment of lung functions, assisting the patient in therapeutic exercise and monitoring mechanical assistance to ventilation.

73. Radiologic Technologist. An individual who is trained and qualified in the art and science of use of both ionizing and non-ionizing radiation for the purposes of diagnostic medical imaging, interventional procedures, and therapeutic treatment.

74. Recreation Therapist. A recreation therapist uses recreational activities for intervention in some physical, social or emotional behavior to bring about a desired change in that behavior and promote the growth and development of the patient. *Source: Joel A. DeLisa and Bruce M. Gans, Rehabilitation Medicine: Principles and Practice Second Edition, J.B. Lippincott Company, Philadelphia: 1993, p. 7.*

75. Registered Nurse (R.N.)

a. A R.N. is a person qualified by graduation from an accredited nursing school (depending upon schooling, a R.N. may receive either a diploma from a hospital program, an associate degree in nursing (A.D.N.) or a Bachelor of Science degree in nursing (B.S.N.), who is licensed or certified by the state, and is practicing within the scope of that license or certification. R.N.s assist patients in recovering and maintaining their physical or mental health. They assist physicians during treatments and examinations and administer medications.

b. A provider who is trained and educated in a formal nursing education program at an accredited school of nursing, passes a national certification examination, and is licensed by the state to practice nursing. The individual provides nursing services to patients or clients in areas such as health promotion, disease prevention, acute and chronic care, and restoration and maintenance of health across the life span. *Sources: American Nurses Association, American Nurses Credentialing Center, 1996 Certification Catalogue, and Rhea, Ott, and Shafritz, The Facts on File Dictionary of Health Care Management, New York: Facts on File Publications, 1988.*

76. Rehabilitation Counselor. An individual trained and educated in a systematic process of assisting persons with physical, mental, developmental, cognitive, and emotional disabilities to achieve their personal, career, and independent living goals assessment and appraisal, diagnosis and treatment planning, career (vocational) counseling, individual and group counseling interventions for adjustments to the medical and psychosocial impact of disability, case management, program evaluation and research, job analysis and placement counseling, and consultation on rehabilitation resources and technology. Certification generally requires a Master's degree with specialized courses in rehabilitation processes and technology. *Sources: Commission on Rehabilitation Counselor Certification and Rhea, Ott, and Shafritz, The Facts on File Dictionary of Health Care Management, New York: Facts on File Publications, 1988.*

77. Rehabilitation Practitioner. A health care practitioner who trains or retrains individuals disabled by disease or injury to help them attain their maximum functional capacity.

78. Respiratory, Rehabilitative and Restorative Service Provider. A provider who is trained and educated to perform services related to respiratory care, physical therapy, occupational therapy, rehabilitation and restorative services and may be licensed, certified or practice within the scope of training.

79. Respiratory Therapist. A respiratory therapist is a person who has graduated from a respiratory therapy program accredited by the Committee on Allied Health Education and Accreditation, and where applicable, is licensed by the state and is practicing within the scope of that license. A respiratory therapist administers oxygen and other gases and provides assistance with equipment to patients with either acute or chronic breathing difficulties, often within the home.

80. Resident. The term "resident" refers to an individual who is engaged in a graduate training program in medicine (which includes all specialties, such as internal medicine, surgery,

psychiatry, radiology, or nuclear medicine), dentistry, podiatry, and optometry that participate in patient care under the direction of teaching physicians. Such programs must be accredited by the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME), American Osteopathic Association (AOA), American Dental Association, American Podiatric Medicine Association (APMA) Council on Podiatric Medical Education, or Council on Optometric Education (COE) of the American Optometric Association. **NOTE:** *The term “resident” includes individuals in approved subspecialty training programs, who are typically referred to as “fellows.”*

81. Social Worker. A clinical social worker is a person who is qualified by a master of Social Work (M.S.W.) degree, licensed, certified or registered by the state as a social worker and practicing within the scope of that license. A social worker provides assistance and counseling to patients and their families and dealing with social, emotional, and environmental problems.

82. Specialist. An individual educated and trained in an applied knowledge discipline used in the performance of work at a level requiring knowledge and skills beyond or apart from that provided by a general education or liberal arts degree. *Source: Expanded from Webster’s II New Riverside University Dictionary, Boston: Riverside Publishing Company, 1974.*

83. Specialist or Technologist. General classification identifying individuals who are trained on a specific piece of equipment or technical procedure.

84. Specialist or Technologist, Cardiology. An allied health professional who performs diagnostic examinations at the request or direction of a physician in one or more of the following three areas: invasive cardiology, noninvasive cardiology, and noninvasive peripheral vascular study. Cardiovascular technologists are one type of allied health professional for which the Committee on Allied Health Education and Accreditation has accredited education programs. *Source: Lexikon: Dictionary of Health Care Terms, Organizations and Acronyms for the Era of Reform, The Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations, Oakbrook Terrace, Illinois: 1994, p. 159.*

85. Specialist or Technologist, Health Information. An individual with a high school diploma, on-the-job experience and coding education from seminars or college classes who passes a national certification examination in either inpatient and outpatient facility services coding, or physician services coding. *Source: American Health Information Management Association, Chicago, IL, 1996.*

86. Specialist or Technologist, Other. General classification identifying individuals trained on specific equipment and technical procedures in one of a collection of miscellaneous health care disciplines.

87. Specialist or Technologist, Pathology

a. An individual educated and trained in clinical chemistry, microbiology or other biological sciences; and in gathering data on the blood, tissues, and fluids in the human body. Tests and procedures performed or supervised center on major areas of hematology, microbiology, immunohematology, immunology, clinical chemistry, and urinalysis. Education and certification requires the equivalent of an associate degree and alternative combination of accredited training and experience.

b. A specially trained individual who works under the direction of a pathologist, other physician, or scientist, and performs specialized chemical, microscopic, and bacteriological tests of human blood, tissue, and fluids. Also known as medical technologists, they perform and supervise tests and procedures in clinical chemistry, immunology, serology, bacteriology, hematology, parasitology, mycology, urinalysis, and blood banking. The work requires the correlation of test results with other data, interpretation of test findings, and exercise of independent judgment. The minimum educational requirement (for one of several certification programs in medical technology) is a Baccalaureate Degree with appropriate science course requirements, plus a 12-month, structured, American Medical Association (AMA) approved medical technology program and an examination; or a baccalaureate degree with appropriate science course requirements and experience.

88. Specialist or Technologist, Radiology

a. An individual who has completed clinical and academic training in radiographic procedures to support the radiologists in their diagnosis.

b. An individual qualified in the use of both ionizing and non-ionizing radiation for the purposes of diagnostic medical imaging, interventional procedures, and therapeutic treatment. The modalities of interest include, but are not necessarily limited to: radiography, nuclear medicine technology, radiation therapy technology, mammography, cardiovascular-interventional technology, computed tomography, and magnetic resonance imaging. Individuals who meet the specific examination and training requisites may obtain certification and advanced qualification certification through the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists.

89. Speech, Language and Hearing Provider. A provider who renders services to improve communicative skills of people with language, speech and hearing impairments.

90. Speech-Language Pathologist. A speech pathologist is a person qualified by a Master's Degree in speech-language pathology, and where applicable, licensed by the state and practicing within the scope of the license. Also, known as speech therapist, a speech pathologist evaluates patients with language and speech impairments or disorders, whether arising from physiological and neurological disturbances, defective articulation or foreign dialects, and conducts remedial programs designed to restore or improve their communication efficacy. Speech pathologists assess and treat persons with speech, language, voice, and fluency disorders.

91. Technologist, Technician, and Other Technical Service Provider. A broad category grouping providers who apply scientific knowledge in solving practical or theoretical problems or applies technical procedures in accordance with their training and experience.

92. Technician

a. A person with specialized training in a narrow field of expertise whose occupation requires training and is skilled in specific technical processes and procedures. *Sources: Rhea, Ott, and Shafritz, The Facts on File Dictionary of Health Care Management, New York: Facts on File Publications, 1988; Dorland's Illustrated Medical Dictionary, 26th Edition, Philadelphia: W.B. Saunders Company, 1981, and Webster's II New Riverside University Dictionary, Boston: Riverside Publishing Company, 1984.*

b. An individual having special skill or practical knowledge in an area, such as operation and maintenance of equipment or performance of laboratory procedures involving biochemical analyses. Special technical qualifications are normally required, though an increasing number of technicians also possess university degrees in science, and occasionally doctorate degrees. The distinction between technician and technologist in the health care field is not always clear. *Source: Lexikon: Dictionary of Health Care Terms, Organizations and Acronyms for the Era of Reform, The Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations, Oakbrook Terrace, Illinois: 1994, p. 776.*

93. Technician, Cardiology. An individual who has knowledge of specific techniques, instruments, and equipment required in performing specific cardiovascular and/or peripheral vascular diagnostic procedures.

94. Technician, Health Information. Preferred term for an Accredited Health Information Technician who is an individual with an associate's degree from an accredited college or independent study program who is skilled in analyzing health information and in examination of medical records for accuracy, reporting of patient data for reimbursement, and creation of disease registries for researchers. *Source: American Health Information Management Association, Chicago, IL, 1996.*

95. Technician, Other. A collective term for persons with specialized training in various narrow fields of expertise whose occupations require training and skills in specific technical processes and procedures; and where further classification is deemed unnecessary by the user. *Sources: Rhea, Ott, and Shafritz, The Facts on file Dictionary of Health Care Management, New York: Facts on File Publications, 1988; Dorland's Illustrated Medical Dictionary, 26th Edition, Philadelphia: W.B. Saunders Company, 1981; and Webster's II New Riverside University Dictionary, Boston: Riverside Publishing Company, 1984.*

96. Technician, Pathology. An individual with knowledge of specific techniques and instruments who performs all of the routine tests in a medical laboratory and who has the ability to discriminate between similar factors that directly affect procedures and results.

97. Technician or Technologist. A broad category grouping different kinds of technologists and technicians. *NOTE: See individual definitions.*

98. Technologist: A person trained in the study and use of specialized skills, techniques, tools, machines, electronic and other instruments of applied science and engineering, who specializes in a particular occupational or professional field. *Sources: Rhea, Ott, and Shafritz, The Facts on File Dictionary of Health Care Management, New York: Facts on File Publications, 1988;*

Webster's II New Riverside University Dictionary, Boston: Riverside Publishing Company, 1984.

99. Veterinarian. A doctor of veterinary medicine, trained and authorized to practice veterinarian medicine and surgery. Source: Dorland's Illustrated Medical Dictionary, 28th edition, Philadelphia: W.B. Saunders Company, 1994, p. 1823.
