34 graduate credit Master of Science in Clinical Nutrition degree

During the first year of the program, dietetic interns attend classes at NYU on a part-time basis. Typically interns take 6 credits during the Fall, Spring, and Summer semesters. After the dietetic internship concludes in August, one full-time semester at NYU will be left to earn the MS degree in Clinical Nutrition.

Interns are not required to finish the degree to earn a Verification Statement from the JJPVA Dietetic Internship. But they are required to take at least 15 graduate-level credits at NYU during the internship year, August to August, and to maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.8 for those classes in order to successfully complete the internship.
